■ Vocational Major

Earlier this week, we hosted an online information evening for parents of our current Year 10 families in order to share information about the new Vocational Major course. This is a VCE course offered to students who wish to prepare for a post-school entry into the workforce or further vocational learning.

Vocational Major (or VM for short) is part of the VCE program; however, the focus is less on academic learning in preparation for university and more on preparing skills for entering the workforce. This includes the study of Personal Development Skills, Work Related Skills, as well as various VET subjects. Students

undertaking this course will still be part of the cohort of students at RHS and will still graduate with their peers at the end of Year 12.
